A To Z Program:

As we all know, the rate of court reporter attrition has gotten to alarming levels. NCRA has begun the Steno A to Z program to teach basic steno for free to as many people as we can get interested in the program; then at the end of the program, those interested can enroll in a reporting program, either online or brick-and-mortar. A to Z program leaders will work with small groups of participants as they learn how to write the alphabet and numbers in steno. This program does not follow any particular theory. Participants will use loaner steno machines during in-person sessions and for outside practice. Leaders will receive training materials to use during the program. The small group sessions can be done alone or in teams of two or more.
